*SCOPE OF THE EXAMINATION*

In addition, prescribed critical works have been studied concerning the problem of authorship and the nature of the oral epic. Certain passages have been committed to memory.

## *EXAMINERS*

### REV. EDWARD W. BODNAR, S.J.

Father Bodnar received his Master of Arts Degree from St. Louis University and his Doctorate from Princeton University. He spent last year at the American School of Classical Studies in Athens on a Genadeion Fellowship for Post-Classical Studies. He teaches at the Jesuit Seminary, Wernersville, Pa

### REV. WILLIAM F. GRAHAM, S.J.

Father Graham obtained his Master of Arts Degree from Woodstock College, Woodstock, Md. At first teacher of the Classics, he later became Principal of Gonzaga High School, Washington, D.C., and then of St. Joseph's Preparatory School, Philadelphia, Pa. He is now Rector and President of Gonzaga High School.

### DR. JAMES A. McCULLOCH, PH.D.

Dr. McCulloch is a graduate of Duquesne University and received both his Master of Arts Degree and his Doctorate from the University of Pittsburgh. He was awarded a scholarship to the American School of Classical Studies at Athens and a Lawrence Fellowship for post-doctoral work abroad. He is at present Chairman of the Department of Classics at Duquesne University.
